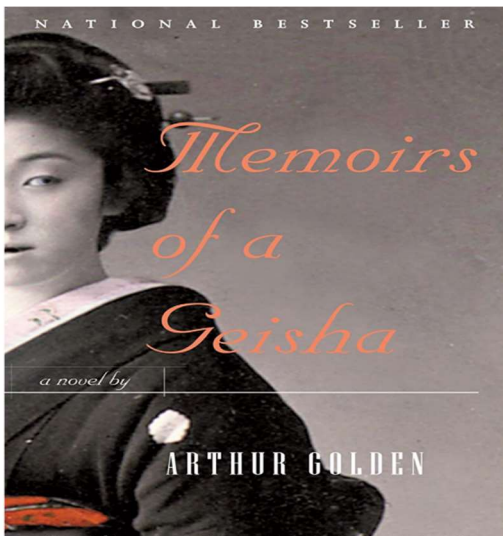
White House Collector!

All available vaccines will be administered to those who **choose** to receive it.

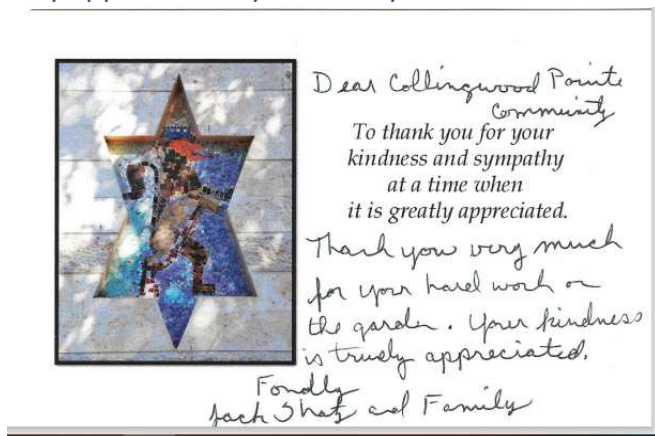
